Figure 1 - Aggregate population density of ridings by elected party

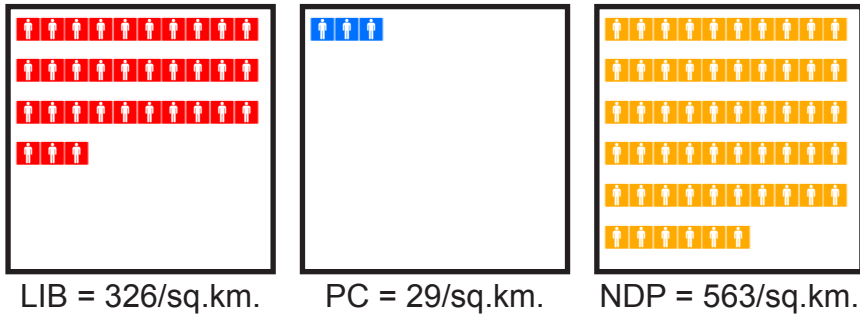
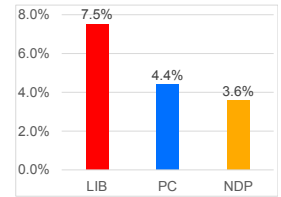

Mode of transport to work by ridings

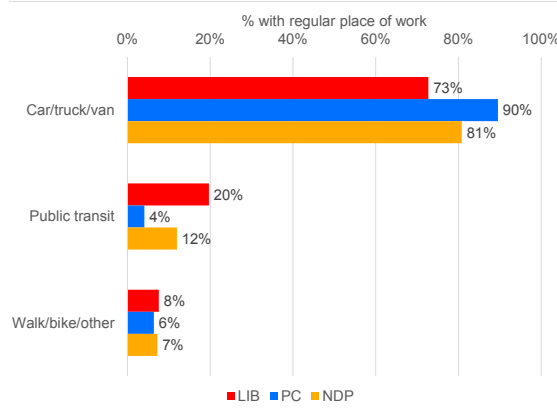

Type of private dwellings by ridings

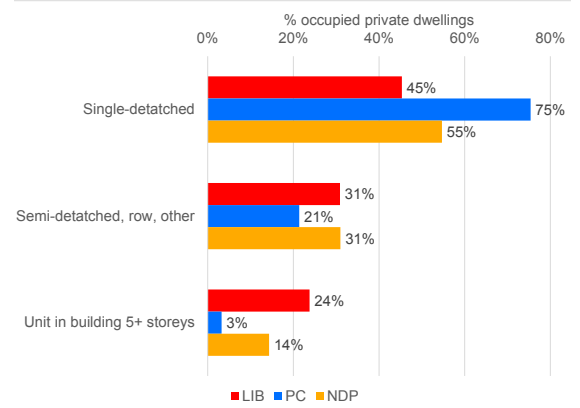
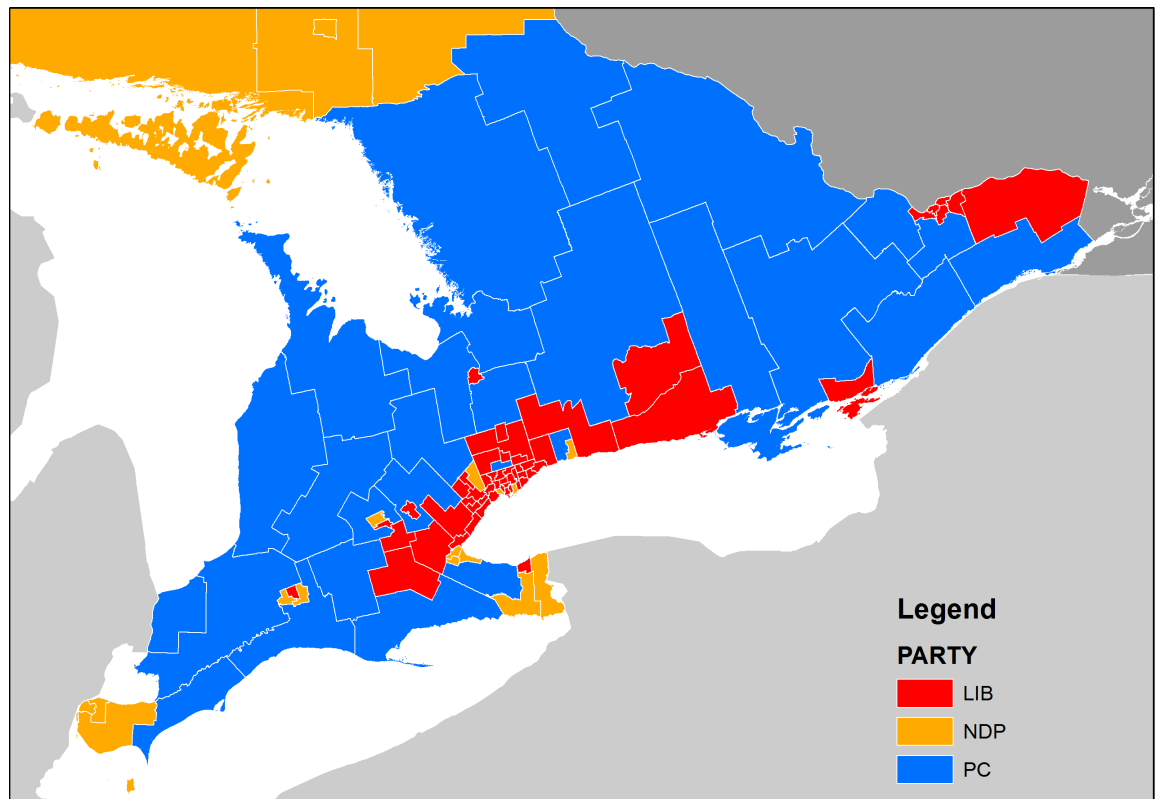


Figure 5 - 2014 Ontario provincial election results by riding

Average house price (000s) by ridings

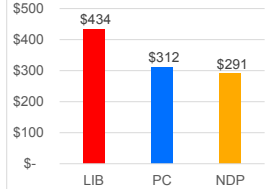

% of households spending > 30% of income on shelter

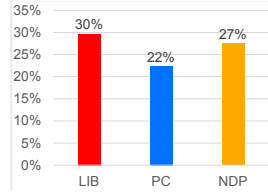

Aggregate demographic profiles of ridings

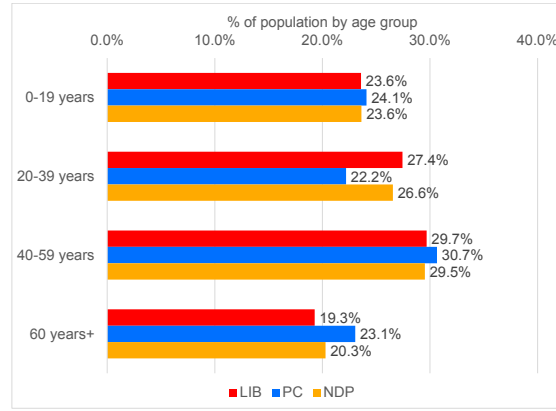

Immigrants as % of population

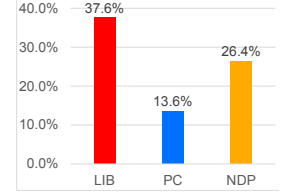

Vote and seat distribution by average income of Southern Ontario ridings

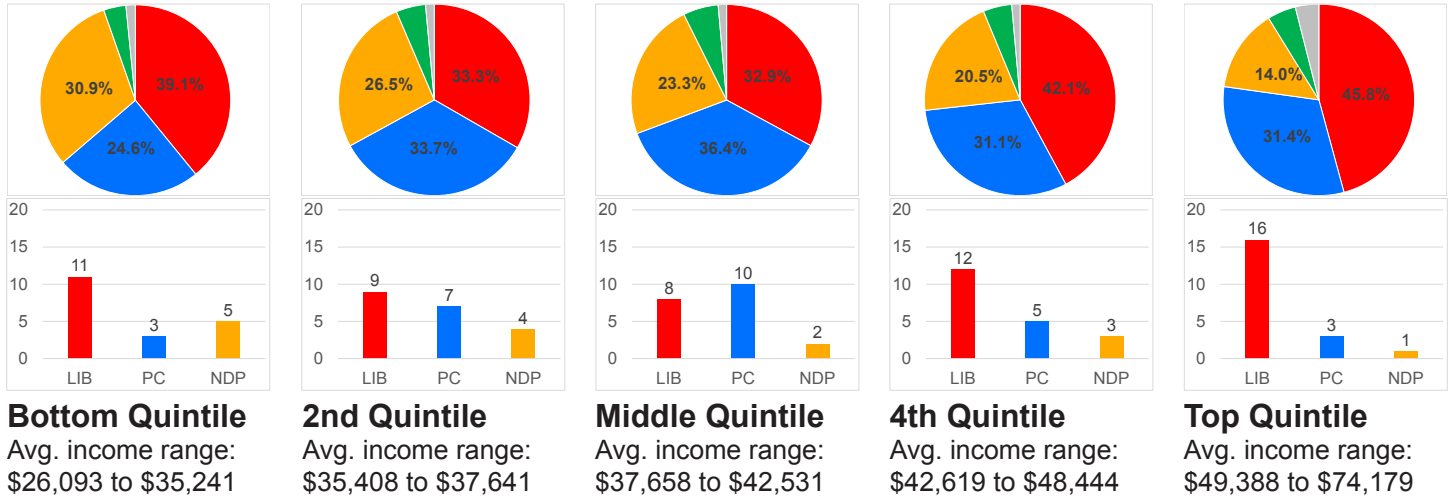

Aggregate industrial profiles of ridings

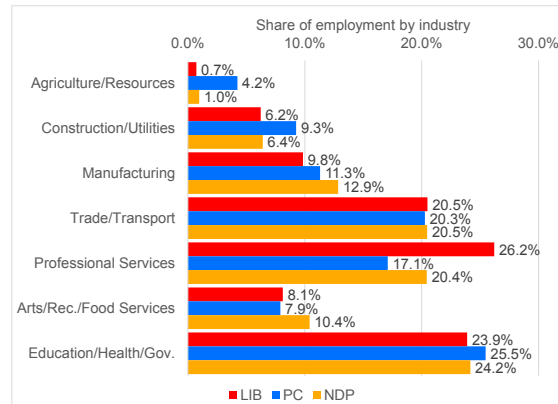
